Weekly Legislative Report

September 20, 2019

After an intense couple of weeks dealing with the redistricting issue and meeting their court-imposed deadline for submitting new legislative district maps, the House and Senate concluded their work for this week on Wednesday and will not reconvene until Monday, September 30, 2019.

There are several high-profile bills remaining in play for the legislature's consideration. Only time will tell which of those will get further attention before the legislature adjourns for the year. In addition, although the House has voted to override Governor Cooper's veto of the State budget bill, the Senate has not yet announced when or if they will vote on an override.

Since the House and Senate will not be in session next week, the NCSA Weekly Legislative Report will not be published next week. We anticipate that the next edition of the WLR will be published on Friday, October 4, 2019.

BILL STATUS

[HOUSE BILL 29](#), Standing Up for Rape Victims Act of 2019, which is summarized in the February 28, 2019 Weekly Legislative Report, has been approved by the General Assembly and has been signed into law by Governor Roy Cooper with an effective date of September 18, 2019. **The North Carolina Sheriffs' Association SUPPORTS this bill.**

[HOUSE BILL 75](#), School Safety Funds, Programs and Reports, which is summarized in the September 13, 2019 Weekly Legislative Report, has been approved by the General Assembly and has been signed into law by Governor Roy Cooper with an effective date of July 1, 2019, unless noted otherwise in the bill.

[HOUSE BILL 211](#), Various DMV Changes, which is summarized in the March 15, 2019 Weekly Legislative Report, has been approved by the General Assembly and sent to Governor Roy Cooper for his signature.

[SENATE BILL 118](#), Prison Safety/TANF State Plan/Clarifications, which is summarized in the September 13, 2019 Weekly Legislative Report, has been approved by the General Assembly and has been signed into law by Governor Roy Cooper with an effective date of July 1, 2019.
